Course Description

This course is designed to introduce students to the unique relationship between people, their leaders, and their expenditures. We will examine closely the economic and governmental systems in the United States and around the world. The students will be given an opportunity to analyze the study of choices. These choices are often financial, but they may extend beyond the realm of "money" to concerns about quality of life, happiness and success. We will examine choices both on a small (micro) and large (macro) scale. Emphasis will be placed on the past, current, and projected future impact of the choices that have been made throughout the world around us. Subsequently, the bulk of the work in this class is not to prepare students to succeed on Jeopardy, but rather to develop each student's ability to understand the complexity of the economic, political and social world around them.

Course Methods

We will explore the state standards for Economics through the following means:

- Readings from the textbook, newspapers and other materials
- Lectures and note-taking
- Class discussions
- Films
- Term projects
- Small group activities

<u>Assessment</u>

Quizzes will be given on assigned reading and material discussed in class. Although quizzes are usually announced in advance, students should be prepared for quizzes at any time.

At the end of each major unit, students will be given an exam based on readings, lectures, discussions, and film materials. Students will be notified at least one week in advance of any test. The tests include multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank, short answer, and essay questions.
