

School Profile 2016-2017

Introduction

Ghidotti Early College High School (GECHS) is located on the Nevada County Sierra Community College Campus. Originally funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, GECHS opened in Fall 2006 as a partnership between Sierra College and the Nevada Joint Union High School District. Our student population is capped at 160 students approximately 40 per grade level. GECHS is one of 23 Early College programs in the state of California. Ghidotti students may be dual enrolled in a maximum of 11 college units each semester. By design our students begin with more high school class and less college and this shifts as the years progress.



Students must earn a minimum of 220 credits and complete the coursework outlined below.

Ghidotti Early College High School does not compute class rank, as it does not fully reflect the achievements of our students.


Credits earned through Sierra College

One semester of a college level course equates to one full year of a high school course. For example, one semester of MATH 0008 (Trigonometry), a transfer level college course, is equivalent to a full year of high school math. World Language is the only exception: one semester of a college level language such as Spanish, Deaf Studies or French equates to two year at a traditional high school. The second semester equates to year three at a traditional high school.
